POSSIBLE COVID-19 VACCINE SIDE EFFECTS

Not everyone experiences side effects in the same way. Our bodies have varied responses to building antibodies over time. Below is a list of POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS. If you experience NO SIDE EFFECTS, that is also a normal immune response for many people and not something to be concerned about.

Timeline for the onset of potential side effects:		
Will usually start within the first 3 days after injection.	Will usually start within the first 3 days after injection.	Will start within a few minutes to 1 hour after injection.
What to do if you experience side effects:		
Apply cool compress. Should resolve after a few days.	Acetaminophen/Tylenol Rest and take fluids. Should resolve within 72 hrs.	Call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest hospital.

TAKE CARE, AND REMEMBER:

- If you experience a severe allergic reaction, call 911, or go to the nearest hospital.
- Call your healthcare provider if you have any side effects that last more than 72 hours.
- For pain you may take acetaminophen (Tylenol) but not (ibuprophen or naproxen).
